Backyard Burning

This is a reminder that burning leaves, branches, rubbish, other yard waste, or anything that creates black smoke or offensive odors are prohibited.

Please burn responsibly and ensure your backyard fire pit\outdoor fireplace:

- Is at least 3m away from any building, fence, tree, etc.
- Contained using a non-combustible container\material.
- Supervised at all times.
- Does not create a nuisance or inconvenience to others.

What NOT to flush

The Town would like to remind residents that the only things to flush down the toilet is toilet paper and human waste. Anything else can clog pipes and create sewer backups which can be costly for both the Town and homeowner. Items to NOT flush include:

- Wipes, even if they say "flushable" or "disposable".
- Facial tissue, napkins, paper towel, Lysol wipes, etc.

These items do not break down like toilet paper and can cause major blockages in the sewer system. Please dispose of these items in the trash.

Spring Clean Up

The Town will be bringing in 4 large Loraas bins for residents to use. They will be delivered Friday, May 21st and will be removed Tuesday, May 25th. The bins will be emptied once on Saturday, May 22nd. The bins will be located near the mailboxes, at the Town shop, and near the skate shack.

Please respect the bins.

- ABSOLUTELY NO TIRES ALLOWED. We will be fined for any tires placed in these bins.
- If the bin is full, please find an empty bin or wait for them to be emptied. Any refuse dumped on the ground will be returned to its owner.
- The bins are to be used by Town residents only. Anyone NOT from Town, who attempts to dispose of goods, will be asked to leave with their trash.

- It shall be lawful for the driver to operate an all-terrain vehicle from their place of residence or place of business to the closest point of exit and from the closest point of exit to their place of residence or place of business, taking the shortest route available. All drivers are reminded that they must follow the regulations as defined in the respectable Acts.
- An all-terrain vehicle may be operated between the hours of 7a.m. and 11p.m.
- No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle at a speed greater than 20 km/hr.

If you witness people operating ATVs unlawfully, please contact the RCMP.
